FROM THE PASTOR: HOPE AWAITS

Advent begins this year on December 1, four Sundays before Christmas. Advent is also the official beginning of the church liturgical year, not January 1 like in the calendar year. The word Advent comes from the Latin word adventus, which means coming. During these four weeks, we prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ. We anticipate celebrating the birth of Christ at his first coming and the hope it offers for our world now. And we anticipate the second coming of Christ, when our long-awaited hope for a world devoid of sin and injustices and filled instead with peace, joy, and love will finally be realized. During Advent we wait for the coming of the One who is the Light of the world who is and will overcome the darkness.

The title of our Advent sermon series this year is Hope Awaits. With hope, there is always waiting. By its very definition, hope is longing for something to happen that hasn't happened yet. However, hope, true hope, isn't just an idle wish for something to happen but with no real expectation of it coming true. Hope is not mere wishful thinking. No, hope is also having a confident expectation or trust that what we hope for is going to happen. Hope is faith in the future.

In the cynical nothing but bad news world in which we live, it can be mighty hard to have faith in the future. But that is exactly what Advent is all about! Advent reminds us of God's ultimate bright future for us that is a sure thing. We see this hoped for future partially come to fruition with the birth of Christ. As we reflect on and celebrate what God has done in the past, it emboldens our hope in the future that still awaits.

Do you find yourself longing to feel hope again for yourself and for our world? There is no place better for you than to join us for this special Advent sermon series. Join us every Sunday in December at 8:30 am or 11 am for

STEWARDSHIP: Too Much Stuff

Do you ever look around and think, "I have too much stuff"? I'm at that point in my life. My wife Bridget and I are empty nesters, yet our four-bedroom house feels crowded—books, tools, fabric, you name it.

As the holidays approach, I find myself telling people I don't need more "stuff." Maybe you feel the same or know someone who does. This brings up an important question: How can we, as followers of Jesus, celebrate his birthday by giving gifts that truly matter? What if we shifted our focus to giving gifts that meet real needs? Here are two ideas to spark your creativity:

- Canned Food Donation: Wrap a can of green beans with a label saying, "Merry Christmas! This represents a case of canned vegetables donated to the SFUMC food pantry to feed 12 families." Bring the case of veggies to church to make it happen.
- **Backpack Program:** Purchase a luggage tag and replace the address card with a note that says, "Merry Christmas! I've donated a backpack filled with food for a child's weekend meals." Bring \$20 or \$25 to church in an envelope marked for the Backpack program.

These are just two ideas, but if you talk to some of our creative, mission-minded folks in our church, they will no doubt come up with some that will excite the "I've got too much stuff" people on your Christmas list! Adding this kind of gift-giving to your other shopping will still give something tangible to wrap while supporting church missions. The recipient gets a meaningful gift, and the end beneficiaries receive the help they truly need.

One year, my church raised funds for blankets for disaster victims through Church World Service. We made Valentine's cards with a piece of blanket fabric inside as a "thank you" for donations. It was creative, calorie-free, and made a real difference.

This Advent/Christmas season, let's get creative. Together, we can share Christ's love in meaningful ways—helping those in need while lightening the burden of "too much stuff."


